shortlisted for the bread and roses prize 2016 shortlisted for the green carnation prize 2015 shortlisted for the academy of british cover design awards 2015 artwash is an intervention into the unsavoury role of the big oil company s sponsorship of the arts in britain based on the high profile campaign liberate tate mel evans targets chevron exxonmobil bp and shell s collaboration with institutions such as the tate in an attempt to end the poisonous relationship forever based on years of undercover research grassroots investigation and activism as well as performance and cultural interventions mel evans draws together the story of the campaign and its journey which has gone from strength to strength artwash shows how corporate sponsorship of the arts erases unsightly environmental destruction and obscures the strategies of oil company pr executives who rely on cultural philanthropy the conclusion sounds a note of hope major institutions such as the southbank centre have already agreed to cut sponsorship and tribunals are happening which are taking these relationships to task artists and employees are developing new methods of work which publicly confront the oil companies like the anti tobacco campaign before it this will be an important cultural and political turn for years to come

following liberation in april 1945 vienna was characterized by destruction cold hunger and an acute housing shortage yet cultural life soon returned as early as 27 april soviet officers ordered its revival it was not long until the other allies france britain and the usa launched their own cultural campaigns the many cultural activities under allied occupation were intended not only to underpin economic and political rebuilding but also to promote an austrian national consciousness a separate self image independent from germany this volume is the first to show the impact of allied cultural policy in the fields of fine art film literature and libraries music and theatre press photography print media radio and sport thereby documenting an achievement that can still be felt today the creation of a democratic austrian identity

art first became public in britain through a series of interlocking relationships between national galleries patrons collections of art and sections or classes of the population as a whole this study concentrates on london and analyzes the formation of the major national art institutions at its geographical and managerial centre

naum gabo 1890 1977 whose eventful life took him from his native russia to berlin paris london and finally the united states achieved renown as one of the most inventive and controversial figures in twentieth century sculpture this book is the first comprehensive account of gabo s life career and artistic theory and practice martin hammer and christina lodder explore in detail the evolution of the artist s work and his aesthetic concerns creative processes assimilation of such new materials as plastic and approach to public sculpture the authors also examine his response

to the scientific and political revolutions of his age and trace the origins and development of gabo's utopian conviction that constructivist art was profoundly in tune with modernity social progress and advances in science and technology drawing on gabo's extensive and largely unpublished archives of letters diaries notebooks models and sketchbooks hammer and lodder discuss the sculptor's work in the context of his relations with other avant garde artists architects and critics including his brother antoine pevsner they also situate his aesthetic theory and practice within the constructi

the henry moore institute is a world recognised centre for the study of sculpture in the heart of leeds an award winning exhibitions venue research centre library and sculpture archive the institute hosts a year round programme of exhibitions conferences lectures research and publications that aim to expand the understanding and scholarship of historical and contemporary sculpture it is a part of the henry moore foundation which was set up by moore in 1977 to encourage appreciation of the visual arts especially sculpture sculpture and the museum is the first in depth examination of the varying roles and meanings assigned to sculpture in museums and galleries during the modern period from neo classical to contemporary art practice it considers a rich array of curatorial strategies and settings in order to examine the many reasons why sculpture has enjoyed a position of such considerable importance and complexity within the institutional framework of the museum and how changes to the museum have altered in turn the ways that we perceive the sculpture within it in particular the contributors consider the complex issue of how best to display sculpture across different periods and according to varying curatorial philosophies sculptors discussed include canova rodin henry moore flaxman and contemporary artists such as rebecca horn rachel whiteread mark dion and olafur eliasson with a variety of museums in america canada the uk and europe presented as case studies underlying all of these discussions is a concern to chart the critical importance of the acquisition placement and display of sculpture in museums and to explore the importance of sculptures as a forum for the expression of programmatic statements of power prestige and the museum's own sense of itself in relation to its audience and its broader institutional aspirations we have become familiar with the notion that sculpture has moved into the expanded field but this field has remained remarkably faithful to defining sculpture on its own terms sculpture can be distinct but it is rarely autonomous for too long studied apart within a monographic or survey format sculpture demands to be reintegrated with the other histories of which it is a part in the interests of representing recent moves in this direction this series will provide a forum for the publication and stimulation of new research examining sculpture's relationship with the world around it with other disciplines and with other material contexts

a groundbreaking and extensively researched account of the 1960s london art scene in the 1960s london became a vibrant hub of artistic production postwar reconstruction jet air travel television arts programs new color supplements a generation of young artists dealers and curators the influx of international film companies the projection of creative britain as a national brand all nurtured and promoted the emergence of london as a new capital of art extensively illustrated and researched this book offers an unprecedented rich account of the social field that constituted the lively london scene of the 1960s in clear fluent prose tickner presents an innovative sequence of critical case studies each of which explores a particular institution or event in the cultural life of london between 1962 and 1968 the result is a kaleidoscopic view of an exuberant decade in the history of british art

the first book to devote serious attention to questions of scale in contemporary sculpture this study considers the phenomenon within the interlinked cultural and socio historical framework of the legacies of postmodern theory and the growth of global capitalism in particular the book traces the impact of postmodern theory on concepts of measurement and exaggeration and analyses the relationship between this philosophy and the sculptural trend that has developed since the early 1990s rachel wells examines the arresting international trend of sculpture exploring scale including american precedents from the 1970s and 1980s and work by the young british artists noting that the emergence of this sculptural trend coincides with the end of the cold war wells suggests a similarity between the quantitative ratio of scale and the growth of global capitalism that has replaced the former status quo of qualitatively opposed systems this study also claims the allegorical

nature of scale in contemporary sculpture outlining its potential for critique or complicity in a system dominated by quantitative criteria of value in a period characterised by uncertainty and incommensurability wells demonstrates that scale in contemporary sculpture can suggest the possibility of and even an unashamed reliance upon comparison and external difference in the construction of meaning

nine previously unpublished essays form an interdisciplinary assessment of urban memory in the modern city analysing this burgeoning area of interest from the perspectives of sociology architectural and art history psychoanalysis culture and critical theory featuring a wealth of illustrations images maps and specially commissioned artwork this work applies a critical and creative approach to existing theories of urban memory and examines how these ideas are actualised in the forms of the built environment in the modernist and post industrial city a particular area of focus is post industrial manchester but the book also includes studies of current day singapore new york after 9 11 modern museums in industrial gallery spaces the writings of paul auster and w g sebald memorials built in concrete and contemporary art

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
